- Aims and Objectives
 - The graduate programme at Master's level in TELL aims to develop the knowledge, skills and experiences needed today for professional careers in teaching second/foreign language with the use of new technologies at all levels of education (pre-primary, primary, secondary, tertiary)
 - The programme aims to meet the needs of language teachers **worldwide**
 - The programme has received **accreditation** from the Higher Education Quality Assurance and Certification Agency (CYQAA).



Learning Outcomes

By the end of the programme, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of the literature and the methodology in the field of TELL through conducting research
- Acquire and employ specialised knowledge, skills and experiences in TELL and in Autonomous and Lifelong Learning
- Show competency in using relevant methods and techniques applicable to their own research in the field of TELL
- Critically evaluate, analyse and interpret new research data in the framework of the field of TELL
- Articulate and report research in a scientific manner and present results in a professional manner

- **Mode:** Exclusively Online
 - Asynchronous
 - Activities and tasks of about 8-10 hours per course weekly.
 - Reading or listening to the course material, responding in different forms (online collaboration, engaging in research and collaborative projects, constructing artefacts)
 - Regular communication with student(s) in various ways such as email, Moodle
 - Recorded lectures followed by asynchronous discussion and content creation in online communities
 - Multimedia presentations
 - **Synchronous**
 - Live online sessions
 - Weekly tutorials
 - Virtual office hours during which students can ask questions
- **Duration:** 3 semesters
- **Language:** English
- **ECTS:** 90

- Admission

To be admitted to the MA in TELL programme, candidates must meet the following entry requirements:

- A Bachelor's Degree in an area related to language / language teaching or education from an internationally recognised university.
- **English language Proficiency** through an internationally recognised test such as TOEFL, IELTS or equivalent. In case a candidate has graduated from a Bachelor's programme taught in English the English proficiency requirement is waived.

Conditional admission

Students who have not been awarded a Bachelor's degree but are in their final year of studies may be conditionally admitted to the Master's programme.

Scholarships

CUT offers scholarships based on socio-economic criteria as described in the University policy on graduate student scholarships.

> Curriculum Philosophy: Levels & Transferable Skills

- Consists of 8 courses plus dissertation (all compulsory)
- Curriculum philosophy: 'understanding by design' approach. Curriculum was designed following a backward approach (Wiggins and McTighe, 2005)/ Setting the expected learning outcomes first

- **Focus:**
 - Learning theories
 - Pedagogical methods and technological applications in language teaching
 - → Application of new technologies in teaching and learning languages taught as a second (L2) or as a Foreign Language (FL)

> Teaching Philosophy & Pedagogy

Based on **student-centred pedagogy** (problem-based and project-based activities). The programme builds on constructivist and constructionist teaching **philosophy.** Particular attention is given to collaborative activities.

- It includes a variety of methods of teaching and learning, the ultimate goal of which is to make students able to experience and apply specific methods in their own practices.
- All students are guided by an academic advisor throughout the programme.

> Assessment approach

Based on the course design, students take one exam for each of the 8 courses.

- In general, students have **different types of assessment tasks** per course.
 - Criteria and rubrics are used for all assessments so that students know how they are assessed.
 - Students receive **feedback** for every task.
- **Assessment tasks include:** Individual and collaborative projects (often projects within a general brief/problem), case studies, student-created digital material, student discussion participation, reflective journal, electronic portfolios (eportfolios), artefact construction, oral presentations, reflective journal, critiques, group and individual feedback, self-evaluation and group/peer evaluation, online quizzes.

> Resources

No particular textbook is used in any of the courses.

The **materials** are compiled and used to suit the aims and expected outcomes of each course. These are informed by **current theories**, **latest developments**, **and practices** in the topics covered.

In general, the materials include:

- Material developed by the instructors
- Research journal articles, books, book chapters, and conference papers 0
- Multimedia material related to the topics covered, found on educational 0 websites (e.g., British Council, OERs)
- Variety of software for language course delivery (synchronous and asynchronous), and language activity construction: Moodle Learning Platform, Google Workspace for Education, Virtual Worlds, Social **Technologies**
