Research Topic Title: History, Theory, and Cultural Contexts of Mediterranean Art

Description:

The proposed doctoral research will examine artistic and cultural coexistence, exchange, and identity in the Mediterranean, with particular attention to the historical and theoretical dimensions of intercultural interaction within the region. The successful candidate will be expected to pursue research that aligns closely with the thematic priorities of the Mediterranean Formations Research Lab and to contribute actively to the development of its research agenda. In addition, the position offers opportunities to participate in the Lab's ongoing research projects and/or to undertake teaching assistant duties, with corresponding financial support provided for each activity. The successful candidate will be expected to:

- conduct original research within the broader framework of the Lab's research priorities;
- participate actively in the activities of Mediterranean Formations, working in close collaboration with members of the research group;
- contribute to the preparation and submission of competitive research proposals for external funding;
- present research findings at international conferences and scholarly events;
- author and publish peer-reviewed articles in reputable academic journals;
- teach or assist in the teaching of undergraduate and/or postgraduate courses, as required.

Required Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree (BA) and/or Master's degree (MA or MPhil) in Art History or a closely related field (such as History and Archaeology, Cultural Studies, or Visual Culture). Candidates holding a first degree with distinction in one of the above fields (or a closely related area) may be considered without a Master's degree; however, possession of a relevant postgraduate qualification will be regarded as an asset.



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- Excellent command of English, both written and spoken, sufficient to support academic writing and participation in international scholarly contexts.
- Knowledge of Italian or another Eastern Mediterranean language (e.g., Turkish or Arabic) will be considered an advantage.
- Strong oral communication and academic writing skills.
